Part 1: Rationale

The Department for Education vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that all pupils leaving primary school are physically literate with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

- To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 indicators:

5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
